TREASURER'S REPORT

May 31, 2018

For the month of May we had operating income of \$92,080 and operating expenses of \$94,385 resulting in an operating loss for the month of (\$2,305). Year to date we have had operating income of \$440,573 and operating expenses of \$409,394 resulting in an operating income for the first five months of \$31,179.

Our month cash balances were operating \$131,438 and replacement funds \$166,485.

Additions to fixed assets for the month was CSU Security Systems \$4,920 for 3 new cameras. 🌿

We do expect to have the quote back in a few weeks. Do you know that in the world of plants for Florida, there are listing's as "desirable for

snow birds" plants. Yes, that is how they are listed. Those plants will bloom during the winter months, which gives the color our residents are asking for. If the project gets done as we have listed and requested, there will be color all year long. Let's wait and see.

The next subject is a great concern for us living on Oakwood North. While we have all night security on Fruitville, the security is not so great along the fence line. The concern came upon our return, when we discovered that two expensive pots along with the plants, which we were planting sitting for over the summer, had disappeared. We ran to the office to report to Sabrina that someone had removed/stolen the expensive ceramic flower pots that we were trusted to care for. To shorten the story, after our "can't believe those pots are gone" and a phone call to the owner, to report the missing items, we were told that they removed the pots themselves but failed to inform us. Whew wee, what a relief.

- ❑ Is the CHECK drawn on a business or individual account that is different from the person buying your item or product?
- ❑ Have you been informed that you were the winner of a LOTTERY, such as Canadian, Australian, El Gordo, or El Mundo, that you did not enter?
- ❑ Have you been instructed to either "WIRE", "SEND" OR "SHIP" MONEY, as soon as possible, to a large U.S. city or to another country, such as Canada, England, or Nigeria?
- ❑ Have you been asked to PAY money to receive a deposit from another country such as Canada, England, or Nigeria?




