


his is the time of year that we have a lot of family and friends for Spring Break. We need to remind our guests of our Park Rules. When riding a bike on our streets you need to travel on the right side of the road with the flow of traffic. Also, when more than one bike is in a group you all need to be on the same side of the road. It is not fair to the operator of a vehicle to drive between bikes heading in the same direction on opposite sides of the road. The driver does not know if one bike is going cut across the road at the last minute. Remember bikes need a front and rear light at night. When walking please walk facing traffic so drivers can see you and you can see the vehicle heading in your direction. I have encountered walkers walking down the middle of the road with earphones on and not knowing that a vehicle is right behind them. You need to be aware of your surroundings. When walking at night please wear light colored clothes and have a flashlight. We also need to explain our swimming pool and hot tub rules to keep everyone safe. Running, jumping and "horseplay" are always prohibited inside swimming pool area fence. The safety rope shall always remain in place. The rope is a safety device required by the Health Department and no one is to be hanging or playing on rope. Diving and jumping in the swimming pool are prohibited. These are just a few rules that I have seen violated over the past couple of years. Please help us keep everyone safe by following the rules. We do not want to lose a

member of our community or a guest for not following some simple rules.

We also have some misunderstanding about the use of the Spa/Hot Tub. The new rule is that anyone can use this area but if you are under the age of 18 you must be accompanied by an adult. The new rule for the swimming pool is also no age restriction. This was changed because the courts have determined that completely restricting the use by age is discrimination. Some Associations have been sued and lost the case.

Finally, on a different subject, I have asked Wanda to head up a committee of volunteers to give the Putt Putt Golf Course a face lift. She has some interesting ideas and will be looking for volunteers to help in this longneeded renovation.

arch is going to be another busy month!


We have our flea market, shows, dances, dinners and other special events.


