FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT



t is the responsibility of the Oakwood Manor Board of Directors to be good stewards of not only the financials of Oakwood Manor but all physical assets. Over the past year the Board of Directors has continued to invest in Oakwood Manor. This is to not only make our facilities safe for residents and their guests, but also to reduce operating costs and protect our investments in physical assets. Just to mention a few of the projects are landscaping, replacement of sanitary sewage lines, concrete sidewalks at park and concrete work at retention pond to include spillway. I could go on, but I know you have seen the improvements and see we are working to protect our investments. The Board is focused on doing the best for our community.

We are starting a new year and we have other projects that need to be addressed. In the spring we put together a Road Committee to address the needs in maintaining our roadways that will take us into the future. The committee requested a Civil Engineering Report to give us a professional assessment on the condition of our roads. Working with the Engineer was a Geo Technical Engineer that did core samples to determine the condition of the base under the asphalt. We have received the 50-page report, and after the committee gets a chance to review it, we will share with the membership.

Our contract with ISS for their services expires on December 31, 2019. I have put together a

Committee to research our options and make recommendations to the Board. I feel this Committee knows the concerns the community has with ISS. It is my understanding that we still have members that can not get channel two and four. I have asked the office to put together a list of addresses that do not have channel 2 and 4, so the Manager and I can present it to ISS. Each member without the service of channel 2 and 4 will need to stop by the office or call to have your name put on the list.

After the first of the year the Landscaping Committee will start planning for landscaping improvements in front of the Clubhouse and other common areas. We have budgeted funding in the 2019 Budget to continue the landscaping improvements.

Mike LeClair has been working on the renovation of the Spa/Hot Tub. The designer that was working on the project lost his studio and all the design work for the project during a recent tornado. He is hoping to continue the work down here this fall so we have something to take to the Membership.

We still have sanitary sewage lines that need to be addressed in the front of the Clubhouse. The lines service the two restrooms off the Lobby and the Apartments above the front of the building. We also need to research the condition of the cast iron sewer lines at the laundry facility.

This is an overview of projects we are looking at and it does not mean we are going to do everything this year. We as a Board of Directors need to make an assessment and set priorities to fix items within the guidelines of our budget. This is the type of items a Facility Manager would include on a one, two- or three-year Capital Budget.

TREASURER'S REPORT September 30, 2018

or the month of September we had operating income of \$84,881 and operating expenses of \$83,327 resulting in an operating profit for the month of \$1,554. Year to date we have had operating income of \$789,445 and operating expenses of \$749,119 resulting in an operating profit for the first nine months of \$40,326.

Our month end cash balances were operating \$127,260 and replacement funds \$218,748.

There were no additions to fixed assets during the month of September.


Our raffle on December 8th will be a bald eagle painting, an afghan and a double casserole carryall. Tickets for raffle will be sold starting October 20th.
